#### From the Minister's Desk

#### Dear Friends,

The pace of change for our nation and across the world continues unabated. The peaceful death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth means that her son is now King Charles III; meanwhile we are now on the third Prime Minister since the last issue of Contact, and facing a challenging winter.

Not as challenging as the plight of the Ukrainians, with the huge damage sustained to their energy infrastructure by the Russians; nor the unfolding disaster of famine in East Africa, one of the many signs of the cost of climate change in the world today.

It's hard to know where to begin – yet the Bible often reminds us that God is on the throne, particularly when we face times of great trial. Our confidence is not in crowns or authorities, but in the living God, who sustains life, and who, through His Son, has rescued us from death.

In the last issue of Contact we reported on the arrival of the new A/V screens and Web Streaming equipment; I'm pleased to add that November is expected see the replacement of our now aging sound system.

This will include new microphones and a better mixer which will integrate the sound with the streaming system.

All of this has been achieved thanks to substantial grants received from the Adapt and Thrive programme and particularly from the Presbytery of Angus, with only a minimal contribution from congregational funds. We were particularly encouraged by a retiring offering gifted at the funeral for Mrs Anne Simmons.

As we go to print, we expect to hear the final approval for the Presbytery Mission Plan at the start of November – now comes the work of implementation. Our Elders have already begun discussions with others in Barry and Panbride, but there is still a great deal to work through.

One small act is a pulpit exchange between myself and Annette Gordon at the beginning of December, but much more will follow in the New Year – with further discussions anticipated with Monifieth and Monikie Newbigging Murroes Tealing congregations.

Times of change will impact us all in different ways, and we must seek the Lord together for wisdom and grace in all our discussions.




